M.G.L. Chapter 55, Section 22 states in part:

Any person or the treasurer of a corporation, association, organization or other group of persons, other than a political committee organized under section 5, which has given paid, expended or contributed, or promised to give, pay, expend or contribute, any money or other thing of value in order to influence or affect the vote on any question submitted to the voters shall file reports setting forth the amount or value of every gift, payment, expenditure or contribution or promise to give, pay, expend or contribute, together with the date, purpose and full name and address of the person to whom it was made.

Any person who makes an expenditure of \$250 or more other than a contribution to a ballot question committee or incurs a liability of \$2 or more to influence or affect the vote on any question submitted to the voters shall file reports setting forth the amount or valicate the expenditure or liability, together with the date, purpose and full name of the person to whom the expenditure was made or the liability incurred.

If the question appears on ballots at a state election, such report shall be filed with the director as follows: (1) the sixtieth day prior to the selection [complete as of the preceding tenth day]; (2) on or before the fifth and twentieth day of each month complete as of the preceding first and fifteenth day of the month, until the election; (3) the twentieth day of November following such election, complete as of the fifteenth day of the month; and (4) the twentieth day of January of each year, complete as of the thirty-first day of December of the prior year, until all declared liabilities of such corporation, association, organization or other group of persons have been discharged.

Any person or corporation, association, organization or other group of persons, other than a political committee organized under and section 5, violating any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50,000 and any officer, director or agent of any such corporation, association, organization or other group of persons violating any provision hereof or authorizing any such violation or any person who violates or in any way knowingly aids or abets the violation of any provision hereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$10,000 or by imprisonment for not more than one year or by both such fine and imprisonment.
